What a great way to start 2025

Over recent years, the giant planters at the front of school by the Robin, Puffin and Flamingo entrance had become overgrown with gorse and other large shrubs and weeds. Early last year the IOM Probation Service cleared the shrubs, and the plot was covered with carpet to allow the large roots to rot. In December, Mr Connelly and Mrs Douglas dug out all the roots, covered the area with cardboard and placed a thin layer of Ballaneven compost (provided by MWT) on top.

A couple of weeks ago when the weather was dry, some of the children planted up the prepared beds. First they mixed the native seeds with sawdust, then carefully sprinkled the seed mix onto the designated area, and finally lightly trod the seeds into the compost. We now look forward to watching this pollinator patch flourish.
