SNACKS IN SCHOOL

If your child wants to bring a mid morning <u>healthy snack</u> that is fine but we ask that fresh fruit/vegetable or dried fruit is the only snack provided.

A piece of fruit like an apple, banana, a few grapes, some raisins or apricots or carrot sticks / cucumber is an easy snack to provide as well as being a healthy choice with no litter.

If you child likes their fruit peeled or cut up please can this be done at home.

We do not allow cereal bars, cakes, biscuits or crisps as a mid-morning snack. We thank you for your help with this.

We also ask that when it is a child's birthday or if they have been away on holiday sweet treats - for example, bags of sweets, chewy bars and birthday cakes are not sent into school for the class teachers to distribute or to be eaten at school.

There are some children in school with allergies and so these items cannot be given out fairly.

Children celebrate birthdays by wearing non-uniform and by being sung to in celebration assembly. Birthday cakes are not needed in school.




